Dear FPC Denton Church Family,

Time to begin a new year! The liturgical church year started at the end of November by switching from the Gospel of Luke readings back to the Gospel of Matthew. You might want to consider reading Matthew this month or engaging in a "Read the Bible in One Year" program. I started last year on my "Read the Bible in Three Years" program---my Bible is opened every day, including devotionals and other Christian writings. I'm not bragging—it is just a part of my personal spiritual walk.

Carolyn Winfrey Gillette, who writes lyrics using Scripture to lift up the different themes and readings from the Bible, has an interesting, thought-provoking one: "If We Talk of Thoughts and Prayers" Tune: O Waly Waly ("Though I May Speak")

If we just talk of thoughts and prayers and don't live out a faith that dares, and don't take on the ways of death, our thoughts and prayers are fleeting breath. If we just dream of what could be and do not build community, and do not seek to change our ways, our dreams of change are false displays.

If we just sing of doing good and don't walk through our neighborhood to learn its hope, to ease its pain, our talk of good is simply vain.

God, may our prayers and dreams and songs lead to a faith that takes on wrongs—that works for peace and justice too, then will our prayers bring joy to you.

Biblical references: Isaiah 58; Matthew 7: 21, 24-27; 1 Corinthians 13: 1, James 2: 14-26; 1 John 3: 18-24.

Here are the readings for January:

January 1: 1st Sunday after Christmas/New Year's Day/Communion. Readings: Psalm 148; Isaiah 63: 7-9; Matthew 2: 13-23; Hebrews 2: 10-18. Sermon Title: "Trust" Theme: Trust in God. Texts: Matthew 2 and Hebrews 2.

January 8, 2023: Baptism of the Lord Sunday. Psalm 29, Isaiah 42: 1-9, Matthew 3: 13-17, Acts 10: 34-43. Sermon Title: "The Chosen One" Theme: Baptism, Calling. Texts: Isaiah 42, Acts 10, Matthew 3.

January 15, 2023: 2nd Sunday after Epiphany. Psalm 40: 1-11, Isaiah 49: 1-7, John 1: 29-42, 1 Corinthians 1: 1-9. Sermon Title: "Examples of Prayer" Theme: Prayer. Text: 1 Corinthians 1.

January 22, 2023: 3rd Sunday after Epiphany. Psalm 27: 1, 4-9, Isaiah 9: 1-4, Matthew 4: 12-23, 1 Corinthians 1: 10-18. Sermon Title: "Power of God" Theme: Power of God. Texts: Psalm 27, Isaiah 9, Matthew 4, 1 Corinthians 1.

January 29, 2023: 4th Sunday after Epiphany. Psalm 15, Micah 6: 1-8, Matthew 5: 1-12, 1 Corinthians 1: 18-31. Sermon Title: "Doing What is Right" Theme: Right Living. Texts: Psalm 15, Micah 6, Matthew 5, 1 Corinthians 1.

Mission News

Food Pantry- We were filling the pantry one day and someone stopped by asking if we were filling or taking from the pantry. This person stated that she had been homeless in the past, but is now helping fill the pantry, "to give back" from when she was in need.

We are aware of a need for diapers and wipes, so remember this when shopping for the food pantry.

During some hard rains this fall the ground in front of the pantry was very muddy. Someone has since donated and installed pieces of flagstone in front of the pantry. That has been very helpful, thank you.

Direction 61:3 (formerly Zoie's Place) is up and running with a house for teenage girls who are aging out of Foster Care. Cumberland Children's Home is doing the same much needed service, assisting kids aging out of foster care to have shelter while they get jobs and get established in the community.


A scripture given me by Marlene Nobles says it all.

Come one come all!


Everyone did a fantastic job of helping at the beginning of Advent! It will take us just minutes to take decorations down and box them to be put away.


