March 16, 2025: 2nd Sunday in Lent. Readings: Psalm 27. Genesis 15: 1-12, 17-18. Luke 13: 31-35. Philippians 3: 17-4:1. Sermon Title: “Our Citizenship”. Sermon Text: Philippians 3. Theme: Citizenship.

March 23, 2025: 3rd Sunday in Lent. Readings: Psalm 63: 1-8. Isaiah 55: 1-9. Luke 13: 1-9. 1 Corinthians 10: 1-13. Sermon Title: “Thirst for the Lord” Sermon Text: Psalm 63. Theme: Discipleship, Thirst for God.

March 30, 2025: 4th Sunday in Lent. Readings: Psalm 32. Joshua 5: 9-12. Luke 15: 1-3, 11b-32. 2 Corinthians 5: 16-21. Sermon Title: “Forgiven”. Sermon Text: Psalm 32. Theme: Sin and Forgiveness.

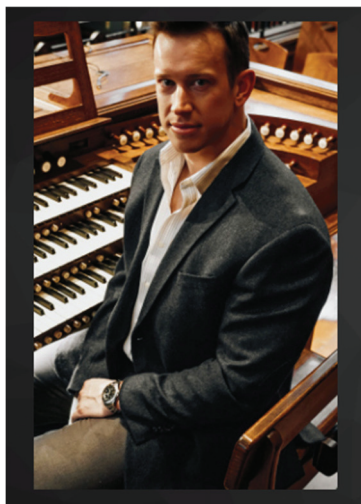

We Welcome Our Interim Organist Dr. Malcolm Matthews!



Malcolm Matthews, who earned a doctoral degree in organ performance from the Eastman School of Music, is one of only four organists to have been awarded the prestigious Artist's Certificate in Eastman's century-long history. In addition to his organ studies with David Higgs, he earned a master's degree in harpsichord performance under William Porter and pursued a minor in collaborative piano with Jean Barr.

Dr. Matthews comes to UNT most recently from the faculty of the Blair School of Music at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee where he served as Adjunct Artist Teacher of Organ and Harpsichord. He also served as associate organist and choirmaster at Christ Church Cathedral in Nashville. Matthews enjoys collaborative work and often accompanies ensembles and soloists across a broad repertoire. He has performed as a soloist with the Oak Ridge Symphony Orchestra, Knoxville Symphony Orchestra, and Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. A featured artist at national conventions of the American Guild of Organists and the Organ Historical Society, his accolades include first place at the 2013 Westfield International Organ Competition, second place at the 2012 National Young Artist's Competition in Organ Performance, semi-finalist at the 2016 International Bach Competition, second place at the 2016 OSM Manulife Competition, first place at the 2005 Southeastern Region IV Young Organists Competition and semi-finalist at the 2009 Concours international d'orgue de Lyon.

The Denton Bach Treble Choral performance “Celebrate Love” was a success! Mission Committee distributed nearly all of the scriptural bookmarks and lollipops, and after enjoying the music, the audience shopped till they dropped at the Valentine’s themed mini market.

Grandmother’s Corn Bread

(page 187)

- 1 c. corn meal (yellow preferred)
- 1 c. flour
- 4 tsp. baking powder
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- pinch salt
- 1 c. milk plus $\frac{1}{4}$ c. water to rinse milk from cup
- 1 egg



Mix dry ingredients. Make a well in this mixture and add milk, water, and egg. Grease a 9X9 inch pan heavily. Pour in the mixture and cook at 425° for 25 minutes. The pan may be greased with bacon drippings for extra flavor.

This is a good basic corn bread for making turkey dressing.

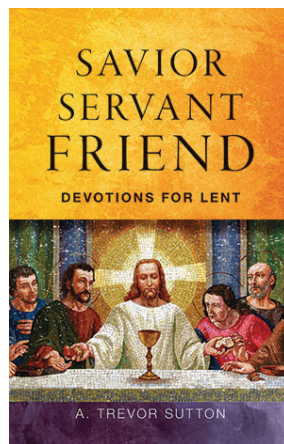

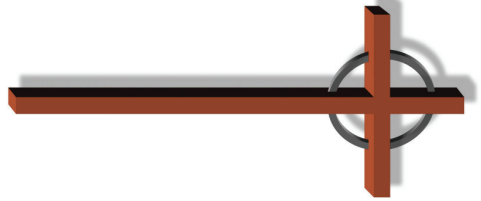
