This is a prayer that I felt needed to be presented. I hope to make a devotional out of it. I used it in my August 25, 2024 sermon. I pray it is a blessing!

The Seven R Prayer

Repent:

2 Chronicles 7: 14: "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

Humble yourself. Kneel in prayer with your head bowed. If you cannot kneel, position yourself in a humble way and bow your head.

Philippians 2: 6-7 speaks of Jesus "who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross!"

If Jesus emptied himself and humbled himself, surely we must empty ourselves of our desires and be willing to be Christ's servant and be obedient to what he desires for us.

As we prepare ourselves for worship and for hearing of God's Word to us in our Sunday services, we confess our sins before God. It is a way to unburden ourselves so that we can come to God with nothing holding us back. Jesus himself preached, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near." (Matthew 4: 17).

Prayer: "Lord Jesus, I'm tired of the sin struggle in my life. I feel distant from you. My choices have not led me into the right places. I've listened to the whispers of my enemy instead of your words in Scripture, and the result has been disastrous. This/these are the burdens that weigh me down (list them). I am truly sorry for grieving your heart, Lord, by doing what is not your will. I turn away from my unrighteous ways. I lay them at your feet, Lord. Not my will, Lord, but yours be done." Amen.

Redeem:

Redemption can be defined as the action of saving or being saved from sin, error, or evil. In the Old Testament, redemption involves deliverance from bondage based on the payment of a price by a redeemer. In the New Testament, Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of Israel's messianic hope and in him, the long-awaited redemption has arrived. Deliverance of humankind from its state of alienation from God has been accomplished through the death and resurrection of Christ.

Ephesians 1:7-8: "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding."

Psalm 130:7: "Israel, put your hope in the Lord, for with the Lord is unfailing love and with him is full redemption."

The attitude of this prayer is one of humility but with a lifting of the head and eyes and hands toward heaven and our Father.


Apoluo in Greek means to free fully, relieve, release, pardon, forgive.

Restore:


Psalm 51: 10-12: "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me."



Pumpkin Bread (page 182)

2 $\frac{3}{4}$ c. sugar
1 c. shortening
3 eggs
2 c. pumpkin
3 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. sifted flour
1/8 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. ground cloves
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. allspice
1 tsp. baking soda

Cream sugar and shortening. Beat in one egg at a time and beat well. Add pumpkin and stir. Add dry ingredients and stir until moist. Do not overmix. Bake in loaf pans, which have been greased and floured. Bake at 350° for 50-60 minutes.


