From a devotional book entitled: Experiencing God's Presence by Chris Tiegreen:

The Scripture reading: Job 23: 14: "He will do to me whatever he has planned. He controls my destiny."

"This statement of faith can be either extremely comforting or extremely terrifying. To Job, it was the latter. He was in a difficult season, and his pleas had not moved God. From all appearances, God's plans would continue on this dreadful course for the foreseeable future. Job's destiny appeared unalterably headed in a frightening direction.

When we are in a season of abundance and promise, Job's declaration is exactly what we want to hear. A hope-filled soul is delighted that God will follow through on His plans and unswervingly control a destiny. We want to know that nothing can thwart His good purposes, that He is keeping us from evil influences and calamitous events. If "whatever he has planned" is positive and in line with our desires, nothing could be more encouraging than His sovereignty.

It's important for our attitude toward God's sovereignty to be influenced by hope regardless of the season we're in. That's easy when we've been seeing the encouraging side of God, but it's profoundly difficult when His goodness has been obscured by a dark season like Job's. Our sense of destiny is only inspiring to us when we fully trust God's goodness. Otherwise, it can be a source of dread.

Expect good things from God—even when you haven't seen many of them lately. Know that He has given you a future and a hope. Let that hope, no matter how hard it is to envision, fill your heart with anticipation. However things look today, the future—your God-ordained future designed by His sovereign purposes—is bright."

The accompanying prayer: "Lord, fill my vision with hope—the expectation of goodness from your hand. You've given promises and offered hope even when I can't see what's ahead. Help me walk in the good purposes you've planned for me. Amen."

Here are the readings for October:

October 1, 2023: World Communion. Communion. Exodus 17: 1-7; Psalm 78: 1-4, 12-16; Matthew 21: 23-32; Philippians 2: 1-13. "Truth and World Views"/Various texts.

October 8, 2023: 19th Sunday after Pentecost. Exodus 20: 1-4, 7-9, 12-20; Psalm 19; Matthew 21: 33-46; Philippians 3: 4b-14. "The Law of the Lord"/Exodus 20 and Psalm 19 texts.

October 15, 2023: 20th Sunday after Pentecost. Exodus 32: 1-14; Psalm 106: 1-6, 19-23; Matthew 22: 1-14; Philippians 4: 1-9. "The Golden Calf"/Exodus 32 and Psalm 106 texts.

October 22, 2023: 21st Sunday after Pentecost. Exodus 33: 12-23; Psalm 99; Matthew 22: 15-22; 1 Thessalonians 1: 1-10. "God's Glory"/Exodus 33 text.

October 29, 2023: Reformation Sunday. Deuteronomy 34: 1-12; Psalm 90: 1-6, 13-17; Matthew 22: 34-46; 1 Thessalonians 2: 1-8. "Reformed and Always Reforming"/Various Texts.

Mission News

Have you ever pulled up to an intersection and seen someone with a sign requesting help? We all wonder about the right thing to do in these circumstances. We do not encourage giving cash.

The mission committee has also wondered, and did some research regarding what other congregations are doing. We have decided to adapt a plan used by a Dallas congregation that seems to be working well.

If you are interested, we ask you to join us in assembling FPC care bags. In your own home, place items useful to those in need in a gallon size plastic bag. The items suggested by the other congregation are listed below. Include a "business card" for the Little Free Pantry. These are available under the tv outside the narthex at church. Place 3 of these bags in your car, and when you come upon someone asking for help, just hand them a bag. Continue the process with 3 more bags as needed or desired. The other congregation asks families to hand out 3 bags every 3 months.

Suggestions for items in the bags:

Granola bars	Peanut butter crackers
Power bars and high protein bars	Crackers
Individual peanut butter containers	Individual pretzel packs
Fruit cups	Raisins
Power aide flavor packets to go in water	Kleenex
Antiseptic wipes	Travel toothbrushes
Female hygiene products	

We were advised not to use anything with cheese, as it does not hold up well.

If after trying this plan and finding it successful, we could expand the idea by ordering items in bulk and assembling bags at the church.

One of our members, Linn Welborn, is a volunteer and member of the Board of Directors. A former member, Ken Royal, benefited from Stepping Stones services for 10 years while dealing with a frontal lobe dementia associated with Parkinson's Disease.

Broccoli-Garlic Cheese Dip (page 17)

- 1½ sticks margarine
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 pkg. frozen chopped broccoli
- 1 (6 oz.) stick Kraft garlic cheese
- 1 can mushroom soup



Sauté onion in melted margarine. Place frozen broccoli in onion mixture and heat until it can be broken apart with a fork. Add the garlic cheese (cut into chunks) and the mushroom soup. Stir just to mix and cook, covered, on low flame for approximately 20 minutes or till cheese melts.

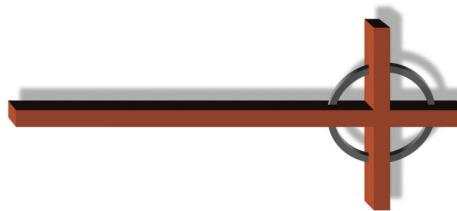
