Dear FPC Denton Church Family,

This is the balance of the prayer that I used in my sermon on August 25, 2024. The first part of seven prayers was in last months CC., Repent, Redeem & Restore.

The Seven R Prayer

Revive:

Psalm 23: 1-2a: “The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. He makes me lie down in green pastures.”

The position for this and the next is still one of “asking”. We are dependent upon God, our Great Shepherd, for all our provision. We pray in the Lord’s Prayer: “Give us this day our daily bread.”

Food revives us, doesn’t it? If you are hungry, a scrap of bread and maybe a piece of fish will give you strength just as it did those 5,000 that Jesus fed with five loaves of bread and two fish.

And what is our “bread”? Psalm 119: 107 says: “I am exceedingly afflicted; Revive me, O Lord, according to thy word.” Psalm 19: 7: “the law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul, the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple.” The Word of God is our bread and reading it, studying it, and meditating on it will revive us.” We have this declaration from Jesus: “I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.” (John 6:35).

Prayer: “Thank you for giving us your words of life found in the Holy Bible. Thank you for sending Jesus to give us your abundant life. Revive me, Lord. I pray for revival in others, in our community, and in the world, Lord.” Amen.

Refresh

Again, I turn to Psalm 23: 2b-3a: “He leads me beside quiet waters, he restores my soul.” Not only is God concerned about our physical bodies, he is also concerned about our souls.

Doesn’t a nice shower seem to refresh you? A cold cup of water in the summertime heat? Water refreshes us and fire purifies us. This makes me think of two Scriptures: Luke 3: 16: “John answered them all, “I baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.” John’s baptism with water symbolized the washing away of sins. Jesus’ baptism with fire includes the power needed to do God’s will.

Say Cheddar!



Nothing Can Get Cheddar Than This: First Presbyterian Receives Surprise Donation of... Cheese!

What would *you* do with 360 lbs. of cheese? Between processing invoices and making the service bulletin, I received an unexpected and surprising call: "I heard about your food pantry... I'm with Corcoran Trucking and we have some surplus cheese that Win-Co can't take. Can we bring it to you?" What a dilemma! Anyone who has tried to fit a sheet cake into the Sybil Hopper fridge knows that we can hardly accommodate a fellowship lunch let alone a truckful of cheese! And yet, we here at First Presbyterian know about the great need for food in our community. You "Cheddar" believe that I accepted the donation, and soon we had an eighteen-wheeler stationed at the back door. Together, the driver, Pastor Debbie, and I unloaded a quarter pallet of shredded mild Cheddar cheese—360 lbs. in total! Working quickly to find a home for this perishable food, we immediately handed some off to a man in need as he walked by. Denton Christian Preschool took another 100 lbs. to use in the children's lunches, and we took 80 lbs. to dole out for those visiting the Little Food Pantry. Our Daily Bread took the rest, and we have now established a relationship with them to pick up perishable food that is dropped off here. When there's a will, there's a way!

The Little Free Pantry is being well used by those in need and contributors from the community. The distribution of emergency food bags by the pastor and church members is also going well. John 7: 37-39a: "On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow within him. By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive." Prayer: "Merciful Lord, unite me to that fountain, that there I may drink of the living spring of water of life and be refreshed in body and in soul. You, O God, are that fountain ever and ever again to be desired and consumed. Always give me this water so that I may never be thirsty again." Amen.

Revere

Time to be up on your feet with heads, eyes and hands lifted up in praise.

Psalm 150: 6 simply says "Let everything that has breath (a soul) praise the Lord."

Chaim Bentorah in his Hebrew Word Study book 2 says that "Hebrew tradition teaches that the Hebrew words for "soul," *neshamah*, and "breath," *neshimah*, are related. The soul fills the entire body, and when a person sleeps, it "rises" to draw down life from above. Similarly, with each and every breath that a person takes—as his breath leaves him from below and returns to him from above—he should praise God, because God renews our breath every minute, not just when we are asleep."

Prayer: "Heavenly Father, I praise you for your infinite greatness and goodness. You are the Creator of heaven and earth, the source of all life and breath. You are the author of life and I am in awe of your creation. You are the Savior of the world and I am amazed at your grace. You are unconditional love. Almighty God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I worship you!" Amen.

Rejoice

Ready to get up and dance?

Philippians 4: 4: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" Ultimate joy comes from Christ dwelling within us. Christ is near, and at his second coming we will fully realize this ultimate joy. He who lives within us will fulfill his final purposes for us.

These notes come from Chaim Bentorah's Hebrew Word Study book 1; "There are over fifteen words in Hebrew for "rejoice" or "joy." They reflect various types of joy such as: the joy of the Lord, joy in performing religious ceremony, joy that is expressed outwardly, an inward feeling of joy not expressed, joy that comes from playing, joy in the success of someone else, joy in victory, joy in being with friends or family, shouting for joy, joy expressed by spinning around in a circle."

"Jesus wants us to bring the message of his love and the cleansing power of his blood to other people. But he also wants us to put down our work and take a little time to just dance with him. Our dancing and rejoicing with Jesus in the beauty of his creation brings just as much joy to him—perhaps more—as the work we do for him."

Prayer: "Father God, I choose to rejoice and be glad. I rejoice in you always. Thank you for loving me and rejoicing over me. I am redeemed. I come with singing, and praising, and dancing, Lord." Amen.

May this prayer be a blessing!




