According to Wikipedia: "He is an American Old Testament scholar and theologian who is widely considered one of the most influential Old Testament scholars of the last several decades. His work often focuses on the Hebrew prophetic tradition and sociopolitical imagination of the Church. He argues that the Church must provide a counter-narrative to the dominant forces of consumerism, militarism, and nationalism." I remember studying some of his work in Seminary. I did read this prayer as a devotional for our last Session meeting as I think it gives us "food for thought" in light of our current situation around the world.

And so we wait for your coming, in your vulnerable baby in whom all things are made new.



November 5, 2023: **All Saints Sunday** (the date is 11-1-23) Communion. All Saints Readings: Psalm 34: 1-10, 22; Matthew 5: 1-12; 1 John 3: 1-3; Revelation 7: 9-17. Readings for 11-5-23: Joshua 3: 7-17; Psalm 107: 1-7, 33-37; Matthew 23: 1-12; 1 Thessalonians 2: 9-13. "Children of God"/1 John 3 text.

November 12, 2023: 24th Sunday after Pentecost. Joshua 24: 1-3a, 14-25; Psalm 78: 1-7; Matthew 25: 1-13; 1 Thessalonians 4: 13-18. "Serving the Lord"/Joshua 24 text.

November 19, 2023: 25th Sunday after Pentecost. **Thanksgiving Service.** (Thanksgiving is 11-23-23). Readings for 11-19: Judges 4: 1-7; Psalm 123: Matthew 25: 14-30; 1 Thessalonians 5: 1-11. Readings for Thanksgiving: Deuteronomy 8: 7-18; Psalm 65; Luke 17: 1-19; 2 Corinthians 9: 6-15. "Giving Thanks"/Deuteronomy 8, Luke 17 and 2 Corinthians 9 texts.

November 26, 2023: **Christ the King Sunday.** Ezekiel 34: 11-16, 20-24; Psalm 100; Matthew 25: 31-46; Ephesians 1: 15-23. "Christ the Judge"/Ezekiel 34, Matthew 25, Ephesians 1 texts.

The first Sunday of Advent is December 3, 2023 Hope - **Hanging of the green**—remember many hands makes the work go fast—the Sunday after Thanksgiving< November 26 following Worship.

3. Some committee members are making gallon size zip-lock food bags ,filled with non-perishable food. These are to carry in their cars and distribute as needed to those asking for food or money.
4. Mission committee members have been contacting church members to update their information for the church directory which has recently been distributed.
5. Mission committees semi-annual collection of Food and Toiletries for Out Daily Bread will be collected in November for December delivery.
6. We have organized a Trunk or Treat event for October 29th in the church parking lot. Trunk or treat is a safe Halloween where candy is distributed out of the trunk of cars.



Sweet Potato Casserole (page 102)

3 c. sweet potatoes, mashed
1/3 c. milk
1/2 c. butter or oleo
1 c. sugar
2 eggs, well beaten
1 tsp. vanilla

Topping:

1/3 c. butter or oleo, melted
1/4 c. flour
1/2 c. brown sugar
1 c. pecans



Mix all the ingredients together and bake in a 400° oven for 20 minutes.

Topping: Pour on top of mixture. Return to 250° oven. Allow topping to melt; serve.

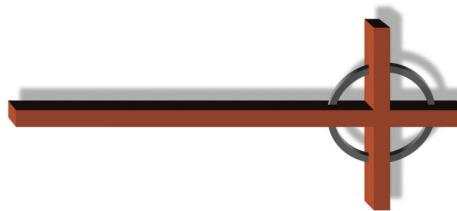
