

Advent time is here! Our "special" services include: Lessons and Carols on Tuesday, December 20 at 7 pm which will include the Christmas readings from Scripture and very special music from Jacob, the choir, and some surprise guests! Our traditional Christmas Eve service will be on Saturday, December 24 beginning with a Tamale supper with all the other "treats" at 6 pm (we do need a head count, please!) and the Candlelight and Communion service will begin at 7 pm. We will have services on both Christmas Day (December 25th) and on New Year's Day (January 1st). There are so many opportunities to share the true meaning of Christmas with your family and friends!

Here are the readings for December:

December 4: Advent 2/Communion. Readings: Psalm 72: 1-7, 18-19; Isaiah 11: 1-10; Matthew 3: 1-12; Romans 15: 4-13. Sermon Title: "Prepare" Theme: Prepare. Text: Matthew 3.

December 11: Advent 3. Readings: Isaiah 35: 1-10; Matthew 11: 2-11; Luke 1: 46b-55; James 5: 7-10. Sermon Title: "Praise" Theme: Praise. Text: Luke 1.

December 18: Advent 4. Readings: Psalm 80: 1-7, 17-19; Isaiah 7: 10-16; Matthew 1: 18-25; Romans 1: 1-7. Sermon Title: "Prophecy". Theme: Prophecy regarding Jesus. Texts: Isaiah 7 and Matthew 1.

(Lessons and Carols, Tuesday, December 20, 7 pm)

December 24: Communion/Christmas Eve. Readings: Psalm 96; Isaiah 9: 2-7; Luke 2: 1-20; Titus 2: 11-14. Sermon Title: "Glory" Theme: Glory of God. Texts: Luke 2 and Titus 2.

December 25: Christmas Day. Readings: Psalm 98; Isaiah 52: 7-10; John 1: 1-14; Hebrews 1: 1-12. Sermon Title: "The Son" Theme: Jesus Texts: All of them but especially John 1 and Hebrews 1.

January 1: 1st Sunday after Christmas/New Year's Day/Communion. Readings: Psalm 148; Isaiah 63: 7-9; Matthew 2: 13-23; Hebrews 2: 10-18. Sermon Title: "Trust" Theme: Trust in God. Texts: Matthew 2 and Hebrews 2.



Tomato Salad (page 48)

1 box lemon jello
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pt. boiling water
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pt. tomato soup
1 c. celery, chopped
1 doz. Stuffed olives, sliced
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pod garlic

Dissolve jello in boiling water. Add tomato soup; let cool, then add celery, olives, and salt. Chill until firm. Serve with salad dressing.

There have been many times when church members, or their families have needed help meeting a rent payment, paying a utility bill or just putting food on their table. Usually the pastor or deacons designate the distribution of these funds.


