Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian Church,

As we enter into 2026 I am reminded of the opening verse of the hymn by the same title:

*"I greet thee whom my sure redeemer art, my only trust and Savior of my heart."*

We enter into the New Year with a sense of vibrancy and hopeful expectation for what God has accomplished. Then in the light of God's faithfulness, we walk ever more so securely in the knowledge that Jesus Christ is redeeming you and me as we participate as the Body of Christ in that work in our world today.

We several exciting events happening in the life of the church. Yes, one is our somewhat delayed stewardship season. 

### Potato Salad (page 52)

4 large potatoes  
 3 dill pickles, diced  
 4 hard boiled eggs, chopped  
 4 green onions, sliced  
 1 c. celery, minced  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  tsp. pepper  
 1 tsp. salt  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. celery salt  
 1 small jar pimentos, chopped  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  green pepper, chopped  
 $1\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. prepared horshradish mustard  
 Sour cream  
 Mayonnaise



Scrub potatoes and boil in jackets until tender. Remove potatoes from water and let dry. Peel and dice. Add rest of ingredients, using enough of sour cream and mayonnaise to make a moist mixture or to your taste (1 or 2 tablespoons of olive oil can be used also if desired). Mix lightly and chill several hours.


