Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian,

This month we move further in the liturgical calendar and enter in the Lenten season beginning with the Ash Wednesday service on Wednesday February 18th. Providing we will have good weather the service will take place 6:30 pm in the evening – more details will come forth in the next week or so. During the Lenten season through Pentecost, my sermons will mostly derive from the Gospel selection from the Revised Common Lectionary. Observing this Lenten season serves as a means of joining with the worldwide body of Christ of reading and listening as a shared experience of encountering the Triune God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit).

As I observe the state of the affairs around us, and the importance of following Jesus' Great Commandment and Great Commission, it seemed appropriate that this Lenten season we lean not simply into What we are to be as followers of Jesus Christ, but more importantly to emphasize How, and even Why our behavior in following Jesus means as much, if not more, to our knowledge, or our "What." There is a wonderful quote accredited to former President Theodore Roosevelt that underscores this, "People don't care how much you know, until they know how much you care."

This Lenten Season let us focus on how we are responding to the culture around us. Whatever choices we make verbally, or relationally with our words, our actions, or our inactions, do they point others to authority of Jesus Christ – who alone is the Lord of our conscience? Let us show them the depth of our knowledge and our care as we mirror to them the Savior, the Lord of our lives.

Transitions begin with an ending, and end in a new beginning. The Lenten season let us move from what we know about ourselves, and transition further into

Interfaith Ministries- \$700


Community Food Bank- \$900

Pork Chop Potato Bake (page 159)

- 6 pork chops
- 6 c. thinly sliced potatoes
- 1½ c. onion
- 1½ (10½) cans condensed celery soup
- 2½ c. boiling water



Peel and slice potatoes and onions. Combine ingredients in a low 2 quart baking dish. Mix celery soup and boiling water together. Pour over the vegetables. Cover and bake 1 hour at 350°. Remove excess fat from 6 rib loin or shoulder pork chops cut ½ inch thick. Partly brown them; place on top of the potatoes. Bake, uncovered for 30 minutes.


